The Senior and Intermediate hurling panels never really played as well as they were capable of doing except for the Duggan Cup Semi Final against Patrickswell when we witnessed one of the finest displays of spirited Hurling from our Senior Hurlers.

Last year saw the Club's first attempt at organising its own Scor competitions, both senior and Juvenile, we had the use of Pearse Stadium on both occasions and all concerned felt that it was a very worthwhile venture for many reasons.
